Course Content

ASDAN

Bronze/Silver award- This award provides a variety of challenges tailored to suit pupils' individual needs and interests. Challenges can be chosen from Modules which include Information Handling, The Community, Sport and Leisure, Home Management, The Environment, Number Handling, Health and Survival, Technology, The Wider World, Expressive Arts and Beliefs and Values.

Lifeskills - This course covers a variety of topics designed to raise self-esteem and personal achievement as well as meet the needs and interests of a wide range of learners. Topics covered in S3 include looking after the home, safety and security in the home, road safety, personal safety, first aid, travel in the community and fund raising. Literacy skills are also enhanced through the use of Successmaker. By covering the topics in this course, pupils have the opportunity to work towards/gain a Bronze/Silver Personal Achievement Award.

Freshstart

Fresh start is jointly taught by PE and SFL. This course is designed to enhance positive relationships, raise self-esteem and encourage engagement in the curriculum, school life and the community through a variety of activities including photography, basic cookery skills, organising social events, enterprise, self-awareness and personal development planning. Pupils have the opportunity to work towards a Bronze/Silver Personal Achievement Award

Spanish Course (Modern Languages/SFL)

This course is available for pupils who have completed the "Les Etudes Francaises" class in S1/2. Topics include personal information, hobbies, food and drink and basic tourist conversations.

Computing

This course teaches basic skills on using the computer, internet and multi-media applications.
